I. INTRODUCTION

Sports officiating can be a fulfilling and challenging avocation. This activity provides individuals with opportunities for physical fitness, earning extra income, meeting people, goal setting, continuing education and public service. Most importantly, officiating interscholastic sports provides officials with the privilege to play a vital role in the education of student athletes.

An interscholastic sports official is an important contributor to the development of young men and women. Because of this role, every official is expected to be a person of good moral character, unquestionable integrity and free of racial, religious and personal bias or prejudice. The sports official represents the very integrity of the game.

Ohio interscholastic sports officials are required to obtain an officiating permit from the Ohio High School Athletic Association. Regulations and control of high school sports officials is the responsibility of the OHSAA Commissioner's office as determined by the Board of Control.

Officiating is a privilege, not a right. Officials that are unfair or biased, exhibit a lack of fitness, fail to comply with OHSAA administrative requirements or exhibit questionable conduct on or off the playing surface can be suspended. The OHSAA reserves the express authority to suspend or permanently revoke any officiating permit.

II. OFFICIATING CODE OF ETHICS

Schools have entrusted us to assist them in the education and development of their youth through athletics. The proper operation of such a process requires that officials be independent, impartial and responsible to people they serve. In recognition of these expectations there is hereby established a Code of Ethics for all officials. The purpose of the code is to establish guidelines for ethical standards of conduct for all officials.

An Official must devote time, thought and study to the rules of the game and the mechanics necessary to carry out these rules so that one may render effective and creditable service in a fair and unbiased manner.

An Official must work with fellow officials and the state association in a spirit of harmony and cooperation in spite of differences of opinion that may arise during debate of points or rules at issue.

An Official must resist every temptation and outside pressure to use one's position as an official to benefit oneself. Under all circumstances, officials must avoid promoting the special interest of any person or group of persons other than the athletes we serve.

An Official must constantly uphold the honor and dignity of the avocation in all personal conduct and relations with the student-athletes, coaches, athletic directors, school administrators, colleagues, and the public, to be a worthy example to the athletes under one's jurisdiction.

An Official will be prepared both physically and mentally, dress according to expectations and maintain a proper appearance that is befitting the importance of the game.

An Official shall avoid the use of tobacco and products at the contest site.

An Official must remember and recognize that it is important to honor contracts regardless of possible inconvenience or financial loss.

Every member of the officiating profession carries a responsibility to act in a manner becoming a professional person. The conduct of any official influences the attitude of the public toward the profession in general as well as toward the official in particular.

III. A COVENANT WITH SPORTS OFFICIALS

Sports officiating is an honorable profession requiring those who engage in it to have strong moral character and integrity. Officials must be fair-minded and courageous. They are expected to embrace and adhere to the *Code of Conduct for Officials*.

It takes a special person to be an official. Sports officials bear great responsibility for engendering public confidence in sports. They are critical to the health of athletic competitions. Officials ensure games are played fairly, by the rules, within the spirit of the rules and in a safe manner. Officiating takes a great deal of preparation, continuing education and commitment of time. Much is asked of those who officiate.

Therefore the OHSAA, its member schools and Certified Assigners hereby resolve and affirm the following:

1) That game assignments and career advancement be provided without regard to age, sex, race, national origin, religion or other factors unrelated to the ability to properly perform officiating duties.

- 2) That effective security be provided to protect sports officials from physical assaults, unseemly verbal abuse and the loss of, or damage to personal property, from arrival at the game or through departure.
- 3) The efforts be supported to limit the liability sports officials can incur as a result of the reasonable and customary decisions they make in fulfilling their officiating duties.
- 4) That the obligations sports officials are expected or required to fulfill be clearly communicated, preferably in writing, in advance of when those obligations are to be carried out.
- 5) That sports officials who are subject to an inquiry concerning alleged improper or inadequate fulfillment of their responsibilities be given fair treatment and an opportunity to respond to the findings through the appeal process before disciplinary measures are taken.

2. If you move from one district to another, your attendance records will remain with the district indicated on your registration card and in the directory of officials unless you update your profile.

V. PROCEDURES FOR OBTAINING AN OHSAA OFFICIATING PERMIT

SECTION A — PREFACE AND INSTRUCTIONS

1. **Beginning Officials in Basketball, Football, Soccer, Volleyball, Baseball, Softball and Wrestling.**
 - a. required to enroll in and complete OHSAA Approved Officiating Classes – Refer to Section “F”.
 - b. Class application fee is required for each sport. Refer to Section “F”.
 - c. After first year, must attend an annual State Rules interpretation meeting and required number of local rules meetings. Refer to Official and Officiating Requirements, Section VII.
 - d. Annual officiating permit fee required for each sport.
2. **Beginning Official in all other sports, except Gymnastics.**
 - a. Application form with applicable fee attached for each sport must be completed with the application deadline – Proceed to Section “B”.
 - b. Applicant with no previous officiating experience in the sport of interest must pass an **open book test at exam center** – Proceed to Section “B”.
 - c. Must attend minimum four local rules meetings – meetings attended prior to test shall be counted towards local meeting requirements.
 - d. After first year, must attend an annual State Rules Interpretation meeting and minimum number of Local Rules meetings. Refer to Official and Officiating Requirements, Section VII.
 - e. Annual Officiating permit fee required for each sport.
 - f. Gymnastics Officials – Refer to Section “G”.
3. **Official Suspended for failure to attend minimum required meetings (Local or State).**
 - a. Application fee required for each sport.
 - b. Must pass **open book test at exam center** (not eligible for home test). See Section “B” for application deadline.
 - c. Must annually attend minimum number of four local rules meeting.
 - d. State Rules Interpretation Meeting not required in year tested, but is an annual requirement thereafter.
 - e. Ineligible for tournament assignments IN THAT SPORT, IN THAT SEASON.
 - f. The officiating test in a given sport may **not** be taken in successive years by same person if that person passed test the preceding year.
 - g. Annual officiating permit fee required for each sport. Refer to Official and OFFICIATING Requirements, Section VII.
4. **An out-of-Ohio Official who is registered in West Virginia, Kentucky, Indiana, Pennsylvania or Michigan, but not registered in Ohio. (Only Ohio residents or residents of a contiguous state may apply for or hold an OHSAA officiating permit.)**
 - a. Must submit application and fee for sport of interest.
 - b. Submission of experience and training in sport of interest required. Refer to Section “C”.
 - c. Pass a **home test** review examination. Refer to Section “C”.
 - d. Must attend minimum required number of four Local Rules Meetings.
 - e. After first year, must annually attend minimum required number of four local rules meetings and a state rules interpretation meeting. Refer to Official and Officiating Requirements. – Section VII.

5. **Person who has experience and certification through another sport Association Officiating program and wants OHSAA Registration.**
 - a. Submission of required application fee along with officiating permits from last three years.
 - b. Pass a **home test** review examination.
 - c. Must attend minimum number of four local rules meetings.
 - d. After first year, must annually attend four local rule meetings and a State Rules Interpretation Meeting. Refer to Officials and Officiating requirements, Section VII.
 - e. Refer to Section “C” for Completion Dates.
 - f. Annual Officiating Permit Fee required for each Sport.
6. **Official who “retired” in good standing and now wishes to reactivate the OHSAA Permit.**
 - a. Application and fee per sport required by application deadline.
 - b. Pass a **home test** review examination. Refer to Section “C”.
 - c. Must attend minimum number of four local rules meetings for each sport.
 - d. After first year, must annually attend four local rules meetings and a State Rules Interpretation Meeting. Refer to Officials and Officiating requirements, Section VII.
 - e. Annual Officiating Permit required for each sport.
7. **Person who failed to pay renewal fee on or before the deadline for renewals.**
 - a. Required to pay renewal fee per sport plus a late penalty fee. Refer to Section “D” for deadline dates and penalty fee.
 - b. Required to attend minimum number of four local Rules Meetings and a State Rules Interpretation Meeting. See Official and Officiating Requirements, Section VII.
 - c. Annual Officiating permit fee required for each sport.
8. **The person who is registered by another State Association and changes residence by moving to Ohio.**
 - a. Must submit application and fee for sport of interest.
 - b. Submission of experience and training in sport of interest required. Refer to Section “C”.
 - c. Pass a **home test** review examination when previous state did not use NFHS rules. Refer to Section “C”.
 - d. Must attend a minimum number of four Local Rules Meetings.
 - e. Must annually attend four local rules meetings and a State Rules Interpretation Meeting. Refer to Officials and Officiating requirements, Section VII.
 - f. Annual Officiating permit fee required for each sport.

SECTION B — APPLICANT WITH NO PREVIOUS OFFICIATING EXPERIENCE OR SUSPENDED OFFICIALS (PREFACE 1 & 2).

1. The examination will be an **open book** test, maximum of one hour in length. Passing score is 75%.
2. The application form must be complete in all respects.
3. The application fee of \$45 per sport stated on the application form must be attached to the application. An application or check sent without the other will not be accepted.
4. The completed application form and application fee must be received by the deadline date.
5. The examination for each sport is administered only once per year on the date indicated. Very rarely are exceptions made to the test date and then only by written request to take a test **earlier** than the test date. **An official suspended for failure to attend required meetings is not eligible for an early testing date.**

6. Any person who is 18 years of age or older and no longer enrolled in high school is eligible to apply. (High school students may enroll in an OHSAA Adult Education Officiating class and obtain a Class 3 permit upon successful completion).
7. No refunds are made after the deadline date.
8. Test dates:

Sports	Application Deadline With Fee	Examination Date
Football, Soccer, Volleyball, Field Hockey	July 31	2nd Mon. in Sept.
Basketball, Ice Hockey, Swimming & Diving, Wrestling	October 31	1st Mon. in Dec.
Baseball, Softball, Track and Field	January 31	3rd Mon. in March

9. OFFICIATING CLASSIFICATION upon successful completion of the test:
 - a) No previous experience in the sport —
 - CLASS 3: All sports when applicant is less than 18 years of age and a high school student. (Applicable only to officiating class applicants)
 - CLASS 2: Baseball, softball, basketball, football, soccer, volleyball, wrestling.
 - CLASS 1: Field hockey, ice hockey, swimming and diving, track and field.
 - b) Suspended officials — Same classification that was held at time of suspension. However, the Class 1 official who reactivates the permit after suspension for failure to attend required meetings is ineligible for tournament assignments in that sport for one year.
10. TEST RESTRICTIONS — The officiating test in a given sport may **not** be taken in successive years by the same person if that person passed the preceding year. **Exception:** The District Officials Committee may waive this restriction for a first year official.

SECTION C — APPLICANT WITH PREVIOUS OFFICIATING EXPERIENCE EXCEPT A SUSPENDED OFFICIAL IN THE SPORT FOR WHICH APPLYING (PREFACE 4-8). CLASS 1 OR 2, DEPENDING ON INDIVIDUAL CIRCUMSTANCES.

1. Individuals who are eligible under this section may obtain an OHSAA officiating permit in any sport for which qualified, providing the following requirements are met:
 - 1.1 Submission of required application with application fee of \$45.
 - 1.2 Submission of experience and training in the sport for which applying.
 - 1.3 Completion of a review examination with a score of 80% or higher.
 - 1.4 All requirements are completed by the following dates:

Field Hockey, Football, Soccer, Volleyball	July 31
Basketball, Ice Hockey, Swimming and Diving, Wrestling	October 31
Baseball, Softball, Track and Field	January 31

SECTION D — LATE RENEWAL — An applicant who failed to pay the renewal fee by June 30, but not later than the late renewal deadline may renew by paying the renewal fee plus a penalty fee of \$50. There is only one penalty fee of \$50 when the late renewals for more than one sport are made at the same time. If the late renewals for more than one sport are made at separate times, there is a penalty fee of \$50 for each.

PROCEDURE — Renew online or send renewal notice or reasonable facsimile with \$90 if paying for one sport so as to reach the OHSAA on or before the deadline date below:

Field Hockey, Football, Soccer, Volleyball July 31

Basketball, Girls Gymnastics, Ice Hockey, Swimming and Diving, Wrestling	October 31
Baseball, Softball, Track and Field	January 31

Missing all renewal dates and the state testing dates will result in an automatic lapse of the officiating permit.

SECTION E — TRANSFERS TO OHIO FROM ANOTHER STATE — RECIPROCITY

An official who moves to Ohio from another state may secure an officiating permit in Ohio upon the presentation of evidence of a current registration as an official in the previous state and upon the payment of Ohio fees, providing there is a reciprocity agreement between the two states and providing this application is made within three months after moving to Ohio.

This reciprocity provision is not applicable to officials in neighboring states who hold current registration in their home state. Such officials must follow the procedure outlined in **Section C**.

The Classification of a transfer official will be assigned by the OHSAA Commissioner after verification of previous training and experience is confirmed.

SECTION F — OFFICIATING TRAINING CLASSES

Officiating Classes may be sponsored by colleges, schools, or local officials associations. The instructor must have completed an OHSAA-conducted workshop and the adult education officiating class must be approved by the OHSAA officials coordinator in advance. Prospective officials enrolled in an officiating class can expect to learn about rules, officiating mechanics, OHSAA regulations, where to get games, how to join an officials' association and what annual requirements must be met to maintain an officiating permit. An instructor must be either a Class 1 or inactive Class 1 official in the sport instructing. All new instructors must complete the NFHS/ASEP on line Principles of Officiating class. Previously approved instructors must complete the Principles class or sport methods class by July 1, 2008. Instructors are also required to register annually, attend a re-certification clinic every three years, and complete necessary online information in a timely manner. Failure of an instructor to submit class information/fees in a timely manner may result in denial of certification or approval to conduct subsequent classes. The following requirements apply for approved basketball, football, volleyball, soccer, baseball, softball and wrestling officiating classes.

1. The applicant must be 18 years of age and no longer enrolled in high school.

EXCEPTION: A person who is in high school may apply for a Class 3 permit through an approved adult education class.

2. Application must be completed through the adult class.
3. Application Fees. The OHSAA fee for each application is \$45 per applicant. The fee covers the cost of rules books, postage and the processing of examinations. Instructors may charge an additional fee up to a maximum of \$85 in excess of the OHSAA application fee. Those who pass will be issued a permit for the current year regardless of when the examination has been given. The renewal fees are payable at the same time as all other registered officials.
4. Successful applicants will be issued a Class 1, 2 or 3 Permit, whichever is applicable.
5. The minimum course of study must include 25 hours of classroom instruction, testing for rules and mechanics, on-floor/field instruction and practical officiating experience.
6. Passing score includes at least a 75% score on the mechanics and rules exams and a passing evaluation (**pass-fail**) of the floor experiences. The minimum level of proficiency must be met in each area.
Any student who receives 65% to 74% on the mechanics or rules exam may request a retest.
7. During the school year that the official completes the Adult Education class, the state and local meeting requirements are waived.

NOTE: Prospective officials in the sports listed above must complete an OHSAA class. The class regulations also apply to other sports, but the instructor in those sports isn't required to be OHSAA certified.

SECTION G — GIRLS GYMNASTICS JUDGES

Judges in girls gymnastics must first receive a rating through the Joint Certification Committee (U.S.A. Gymnastics Judging Program) in order to be eligible for an OHSAA officiating permit.

Contact one of the Test Administrators listed below for testing information. DO NOT contact the OHSAA office.

OHSAA Class 1 Registration

1. Must have tested with the Joint Certification Exam for Women's Gymnastics Judges with the current rules.
2. Must hold a minimum of Level 9 Rating: dated – expiration 2009.
3. Must include photocopy of rating card with application by reciprocity or with renewal form.

OHSAA Class 2 Registration

1. Must have tested with the Joint Certification Exam for Women's Gymnastics Judges with the current rules.
2. Must hold a minimum of Level 8 Rating: dated – expiration 2009.
3. Must include photocopy of rating card with application by reciprocity or with renewal form.

After receiving a current Joint Certification Rating, expiration date 2009, request an application form from the OHSAA Officiating Department to apply for an OHSAA registration by reciprocity.

NOTE: All OHSAA officials are enrolled in the National Federation Officials Association.

SECTION H — RETIRED OFFICIALS (Inactive)

Officials who are retired or others who are interested may apply for Inactive Status. Such status will be granted upon proper application or non-renewal of the active permit. Inactive officials may receive rule books by sending a check for \$20.00 for each sport. The following regulations apply to Inactive Officials.

1. Prohibited from officiating interscholastic contests. (Grades 9-12)
2. Not required to attend local rules discussion meetings or state rules interpretation meetings.
3. Must apply and pass the appropriate rules examination in order to become active in officiating.
4. Active officials who desire a Retired Officiating Permit should apply for such permit as directed on the yearly permit renewal form. In certain circumstances a retired status may be obtained during the year. Please see Section VI-C.
5. No OHSAA insurance is provided for retired officials.
6. NFOA membership is not provided for retired officials.

VI. CLASSIFICATION OF OFFICIALS

A. CLASS DESIGNATIONS

Class 1 — Eligible to officiate all levels. Required for OHSAA postseason tournaments.

Class 2 — Eligible to officiate all levels of contests **except varsity high school** in football, basketball and Referee position in volleyball.

Class 3 — Restricted to 7-8-9th grade and non-school officiating.

C. PROCEDURE TO CHANGE CLASSIFICATION

1. **Class 3 Permit or Class 2 Permit to Class 1** — All sports except Girls Gymnastics.

- 1.1 **Contact local officials association secretary** to obtain an application form and instructions regarding examination time and place and observation procedure.
- 1.2 The applicant shall complete all blanks in the top part of the application form and return to the local association secretary for instructions regarding the examinations and observation procedures.
- 1.3 Each applicant must take a closed book rules examination (Endorsement #1) and a closed book mechanics examination, if available (Endorsement #2). No exceptions. **Passing score is 80% on each examination.**
- 1.4 The observation of the applicant will be conducted according to local association standards and procedures. Endorsement #3 and #4 must be signed.
- 1.5 Endorsement #5 — local association recommendation must be completed.
- 1.6 Completed applications for all sports must be sent to the OHSAA office.

Football, Volleyball, Soccer	by January 1
Basketball, Wrestling	by April 1
Baseball, Softball	by June 1

NOTE: The promotion from one Class to another Class does NOT become effective until August 1 provided the official renews the Officiating Permit.

2. Minimum Eligibility Requirements

- 2.1 The Class 2 official must be 18 years old and out of high school.
- 2.2 Must receive a minimum of two favorable observation reports from Class 1 officials or retired officials who retired with a Class 1 Permit, who have observed the official's work in scheduled athletic contests. **NOTE:** Observation of an official is **not** acceptable when the observing official is officiating with the Class 2 official **in the same contest.**

2.3 Must take the closed book rules and mechanics examination according to the following schedule.

Football, Volleyball, Soccer	November 1
Basketball, Wrestling	February 1
Baseball, Softball	May 1

NOTE: The dates above are the only dates the advancement tests may be given. Contact your local secretary a minimum of three weeks prior to the date listed.

2.4 All requirements must be completed during the same sports season.

3. Class 2 Permit to Class 1 — GIRLS GYMNASTICS ONLY

3.1 Applying for Level 5 Test with USAG Test Administrator.

3.2 Send OHSAA application, application fee and license to OHSAA.

4. Class 1 or 2 Permit to Inactive — During school year for reasons such as employment, medical, family or other hardship.

4.1 Application must be made two weeks prior to the opening date of the sports season (**first date for interscholastic contests**). The application process must include:

- a. Written agreement not to renew Class 1/2 permit for the ensuing school year (could maintain Class 4 permit). The official may obtain a Class 1/2 permit for the ensuing year by following procedure in (Section A-6) & (Section H-3).
- b. Written agreement that official will not work any contests requiring a Class 1/2 during current school year.
- c. Written agreement that failure to abide by the terms of the agreement requires a suspension of officiating privileges for all sports for a period of one to five years as determined by the Commissioner.

4.2 The Local Association Secretary must certify that to the best of his or her knowledge the official is not officiating any contests requiring a Class 1/2 permit.

4.3 The District Officials Secretary is authorized to approve the permit transfer from Class 1/2 to Inactive after a review of the official's past record and any information received from the official and/or members of the District Officials Committee.

4.4 In the event of an adverse decision by the District Officials Secretary, the official may appeal the decision to the District Officials Committee and/or the Appeals and Review Board. Decisions of the Appeals and Review Board are final.

VII. OFFICIAL AND OFFICIATING REQUIREMENTS

A. GENERAL

1. Non-Members of Local Officials Associations

Officials who are not members of any local officials association shall pay \$10 to the secretary of the local association at the local rules discussion meetings attended. Each secretary will provide written documentation to the attending official and record the attendance on line of all officials that attend a meeting. An official who is a member of a local officials association is not required to pay a non-member fee in order to receive attendance credit.

2. Officials in Military Service

An official called into active duty military service may withdraw his/her officiating permit from an active status by notifying the OHSAA office and the district secretary. The official is excused from attending OHSAA meetings and completing the review examination during this time and is not required to pay registration fees and is ineligible to officiate in Ohio during this period of time. Upon returning from active military service, the OHSAA must be notified **WITHIN 30 DAYS**. Upon receipt of a copy of separation orders or sufficient proof of date of separation from active military service plus officiating permit fee, the official's OHSAA officiating permit may be reinstated.

Attendance at local association rules discussion meetings is again required. It will be necessary to again pass the qualification examination(s) if the official fails to become actively reinstated **within 30 days** of date of separation from active military service.

3. Payment of Officiating Permit Fees:

3.1 Renewal officiating permit fees for all officials are due for payment to the OHSAA office during the period **June 1 – June 30**. **Only officials residing in Ohio or a contiguous state are eligible to obtain or renew an OHSAA officiating permit.**

3.2 **RENEWAL NOTICES** are sent from the OHSAA to the address on file of each official eligible to renew. **Only one renewal notice is mailed.** THE OHSAA IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR NON-DELIVERY OF SUCH NOTICES. FAILURE TO RECEIVE A RENEWAL NOTICE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AS A LEGITIMATE REASON FOR FAILURE TO PAY RENEWAL FEES ON TIME!

4. Attendance Requirements:

4.1 **Local Rules Meetings.** An OHSAA Class 1, 2 or 3 registered official must attend four local rules meetings at an OHSAA chartered local association. Ice Hockey and Swimming — 3 meetings.

EXCEPTION: Officials may receive credit for attendance at local rules meetings in other states. It is the responsibility of the official to provide proof of attendance at meetings. This proof of attendance must be forwarded to the local secretary or to the appropriate District Officials Secretary. In addition, the OHSAA Commissioner may allow meeting attendance credit at special events. An official who passed an OHSAA approved officiating class during the **current** school year is not required to attend local rules meetings **during that school year.**

4.2 An official who passed an OHSAA officiating class or the State Rules **Examination**, either supervised or unsupervised, in a given sport for the current year school year is **not** required to attend an OHSAA State Rules Interpretation Meeting in that sport during that same year. **NOTE: This exception does not apply to the examination required as a part of advancement requirements from Class 2 to Class 1.**

4.3 **State Rules Meetings.** An official registered with the OHSAA is required to attend the OHSAA State Rules Interpretation Meeting in the sport in which registered, when required. **State Rules Interpretation Meetings from other states are not acceptable.** In order to receive credit for attendance, the official must be present **within 10 minutes** of the start of the meeting and must stay until the conclusion of the meeting.

The official who arrives after **10 minutes but no later than 20 minutes after** the start of the meeting may file an **appeal**. **No attendance forms will be issued to anyone arriving later than 20 minutes after the start of the meeting.**

An official may request a special make-up state rules meeting after the regular make-up meeting and no later than **two weeks after** the season begins. The cost of this meeting is \$50. Requests after this time must be directed to the Commissioner.

4.4 Officials may review their attendance record on line at www.ohsaa.org. Select meeting attendance login from the officiating menu. The user ID is the officials permit number and password is the zip code of the official.

5. Required Reports:

Officials shall file a written report with the school and the OHSAA office whenever a coach or player is ejected from an athletic contest. Forms can be obtained by contacting your local association secretary or on the web site. The report shall be filed with the reported school and the OHSAA **within 48 hours** of the ejection. Whenever an ejection occurs, the ejecting official shall speak with the offender's principal/athletic director no later than the **first school** day following the ejection. Whenever an ejection occurs, the ejecting official shall speak with the offender's principal/athletic director no later than the **first school** day following the ejection. An Official failing to follow the ejection protocol and/or failing to file the Official's Report may be penalized.

The "Official's Report" form may also be used to report good or poor sportsmanship, severe injuries, facility problems, or equipment problems.

Please use only one form per school. Each offending school will need its own copy. Each report has a document number (top right in red). The offenses are coded by that number and the School Response Form must match that report.

Do not duplicate the forms for use. Do not fax the forms to the OHSAA. It is the official's responsibility to send the forms to the reported school.

Please write legibly and include the ejected person's first and last names. Make sure that the form is complete at the bottom with the date and name of the **administrator** that you spoke with at the school.

6. Failure to fulfill local and/or state meeting requirements:

- 6.1 The official who does not meet minimum attendance requirements may be suspended and the official is ineligible to renew the officiating permit without retesting.
- 6.2 The official will be sent a Notice of Suspension and right to appeal from the DOC secretary.
- 6.3 The Notice of Suspension will specify that the official may appeal by letter or in person to the Officials Appeals and Review Board and the date, time and place of the Officials Appeals and Review Board Meeting.

NOTE: Failure of the official to file an appeal by the date stated in the suspension notice will result in the forfeiture of the right of an official to appeal.

7. Breach of regulations/agreements/ethics and penalties:

7.1 Nonpayment of Officiating Permit Fees.

When an official fails to pay the permit fee by June 30, a late fee will also apply. Officials who pay late may not be considered for tournament selection. When the permit fee and late fee are not received on or before the late payment deadline the official is no longer permitted to officiate and must apply the following school year.

7.2 Failure to Fulfill Game Contract.

Regular Season

When an official fails to fulfill a regular season game contract the offended home school's administrator or certified assigner may require that official pay the contract amount to the offended school or league. If the official does not comply with the directions of the administrator or assigner, the OHSAA shall be notified where upon the official's permit may be suspended.

A game contract is not assignable to any other party without the express written consent of both parties (official and assigning agent).

When either of the contracting parties fails to fulfill/honor a game contract and the act is found to be willful (example: changing a contract date or time; officiating another game - college or high school), the offending party shall pay the other the contract amount. The OHSAA may impose an additional penalty not to exceed \$200 per occurrence.

TOURNAMENT OFFICIATING

When an official fails to fulfill a sectional/district tournament contract obligation the District Athletic Board may require that official to pay the contract amount. The District Athletic Board is authorized to void future contracts in the sectional/district tournaments when it is considered to be in the best interest of the OHSAA sectional/district tournaments. Contracts voided through mutual written consent are not "actionable".

The OHSAA Commissioner may require payment of the contract fee of an official who fails to honor a regional or state tournament contract. The Commissioner may void tournament contracts, at any level of an OHSAA tournament, when it is considered in the best interest of the OHSAA.

7.3 Unsatisfactory Officiating

The OHSAA official's administrator will investigate reports of unsatisfactory officiating when such reports are submitted by school administrator, Assigner, or OHSAA board member or staff.

The OHSAA official's administrator may request information from such parties deemed appropriate. A trained observer/evaluator may be assigned to report on the official's performance. When an official is found to have officiating deficiencies, the official's administrator may request a local association to provide remedial work, or change the official's classification or suspend the official's permit.

7.4 Officiating Without A Proper Permit

An individual who officiates an interscholastic contest without a permit where the OHSAA requires a permit will be fined up to \$200 per occurrence. That person will not be granted an official's permit until the fine is paid.

An official who officiates an interscholastic contest when not qualified by permit to do so may be fined a maximum of \$200 per contest and placed on probation for one year. Multiple offenses may require an official's suspension.

Note 1: Contracts shall be issued to officials who have the proper permit. Contracts shall be signed by officials with the proper permit.

Note 2: School administrators or Assigners may be fined up to \$200 per occurrence for hiring officials without the proper permit.

7.5 Criminal Convictions

1. **New License Application or Renewal.** An Officiating Permit will not be issued or renewed for anyone:

- a. convicted, or adjudicated with a finding of fault, guilt or violation, in regard to an offense involving a minor any sexual offense unless/until such offense has been reversed by proper authority with jurisdiction over the matter; or,
- b. convicted, or adjudicated with a finding of fault, guilt or violation, in regard to an offense involving any illegal/illicit drug or controlled substance as prescribed by federal or state law or regulation, prior to five (5) years following the completion of any sentence/parole/probation period imposed for the offense; or,
- c. currently serving a sentence or a parole/probation period for any offense or adjudication of guilt imposed by any court, judge or administrative body, other than simple traffic violations.

2. **Currently Licensed Officials**

- a. When a currently licensed official is indicted or charged with any criminal offense or charged with a violation of any statute pertaining to minors, drugs or a controlled substance, such license will automatically be suspended, pending resolution of the indictment or charge. Conviction or adjudication of fault, guilt or a violation under any such indictment or charge shall result in immediate and automatic forfeiture of the officiating license.
- b. Currently licensed officials must inform the OHSAA of any such indictment or charge immediately upon receipt of or upon having knowledge of such indictment or charge. Failure to notify the OHSAA shall itself be a basis for immediate and automatic forfeiture of the officiating license.

3. **Reinstatement/Reapplication of License.** An official whose license has been forfeited, suspended or revoked or an applicant who is denied a license, under the provisions of this policy, may petition for reinstatement/reapplication based on the following:

- a. If suspension, revocation or forfeiture of a license is based upon conviction, adjudication or finding as a result of a felony: the official/applicant may petition for a license one year after the completion of the parole/probation period; other than conviction of illegal illicit drugs, controlled substance where a 5 year probation period is used, or immediately upon dismissal or reversal of the charge or conviction (provided the offense was NOT involving a minor or a sexual offense).
- b. If suspension, revocation, forfeiture or denial results from a misdemeanor or other non-felony charge: the official/applicant may petition for a license immediately upon the completion of the parole/probation period (provided the offense was NOT involving a minor or a sexual offense).
- c. If suspension, revocation, forfeiture or denial of a license is based upon any conviction, adjudication or finding involving a minor or sexual offense, reinstatement/reapplication will not be permitted, unless/until such offense has been reversed by proper authority having jurisdiction over the matter.

7.6 Unethical Conduct

Unethical conduct covers a multitude of indiscretions: Failure to accurately complete an Officials Report and submit it in a timely manner; failure to wear the approved uniform; chronic tardiness to games; disruptive behavior during meetings; officiating a contest where there is a conflict of interest; inappropriate dress arriving at or departing from a contest site; use of tobacco at a game site (locker room, field, boiler room, etc.); consuming alcohol on game day prior to a game; disrespectfully addressing fans, players, coaches, administrators, officials; failure to cooperate with OHSAA personnel; illegal gambling; gambling on high school events; campaigning for tournament assignments; and lack of preparation are some examples of unethical conduct. Certainly this listing is not intended to be all-inclusive. Conduct determined to be unethical will be penalized. Penalties may include, but not be limited to, letters of reprimand, public censure, single or multiple contest suspensions, monetary fines up to \$200 per incident.

Note: Individual officials and officiating crews that communicate with coaches and/or administrators in order to solicit tournament votes will become immediately ineligible for tournament officiating.

7.7 Tournament Officials Agreement

Officials selected to officiate OHSAA postseason contests are expected to be a “cut above.” When an official accepts a tournament assignment he/she agrees to be eligible in all respects. In addition the official agrees that he/she will NOT officiate another contest on the same day as the tournament games without the express consent of the District Athletic Board representative (sectional and district contests) or the OHSAA officials administrator (regional and state contests).

Note 1: Officials may request a waiver of the required minimum number of regular season games due to illness or injury. Send your written waiver and physician’s note to Henry Zaborniak, OHSAA.

Note 2: The OHSAA recommends that a coach shall not serve as a tournament official in the same sport in which he/she coaches. If it is necessary to utilize said coach as a tournament official, then the coach shall be assigned to a division other than the division in which he/she coaches.

- 7.8 Each OHSAA sports official agrees that he/she is an independent contractor and that contests under his/her supervision will be administered in an unbiased and non-prejudicial manner and contests will be officiated with adopted mechanics in accordance with NFHS and OHSAA rules and interpretations. In addition, the official agrees that the OHSAA possesses the authority and responsibility to uphold its constitution, bylaws and regulations.

8. Tournament Officials Selection Information

- 8.1 The selection of tournament officials in the sports of cross country, field hockey, track and field, swimming and diving, and girls gymnastics is conducted through an application process. All officials with four or more years of experience may apply for a tournament officiating position. The selections will be finalized by one or more individuals including an OHSAA staff member.
- 8.2 For the sports of soccer, volleyball, football, basketball, wrestling, ice hockey, baseball and softball tournament officials selection will be based on information from head coaches, athletic administrators, assigners, local officials associations, District Athletic Board members and OHSAA staff. Ratings will be provided by head coaches, local associations and OHSAA staff. Votes will be provided by AD’s, DAB’s and Assigners. Coaches ratings will be averaged and used as a multiplier on the accumulative points of the other five categories. The results will be used to rank - State, Regional, District/Sectional. Each pool will consist of more officials than necessary for that level of tournament. The selections for State and Regional tournaments will be finalized by one or more individuals including state interpreter(s) and an OHSAA staff member. The selections for District/Sectional tournaments will be finalized by/through the District Athletic Boards.

9. OHSAA Action Concerning Officials

The OHSAA Board of Control, District Athletic Boards and Administrative Staff possesses the authority and responsibility to uphold the OHSAA constitution, bylaws and regulations. When officials’ behavior or officiating conduct requires OHSAA attention the appropriate board of staff member may immediately rule/act on the situation. When appropriate an investigation may be conducted prior to any ruling or action.

10. Appeals

Two types of appeals exist for officials who have been affected by adverse rulings. An appeal for a suspension due to the official's failure to attend the required number of meetings must be directed to the District Appeals and Review Board. All other appeals will be directed to the OHSAA.

10.1 Failure to attend Local or State Rules Meetings

- a. Notice of suspension from the District Officials Committee and right of appeal
- b. Official sends a written request for appeal to the DOC Secretary by date specified in suspension letter.
- c. Appeals and Review Board will review the appellants' information. Example for consideration may include work schedule, personal or family illness or catastrophe, residential move and military duty.
- d. The A&R Board will render a decision within 24 hours and notify the official via U.S. mail.
- e. The decision of the A&R Board is final.

10.2 Decision or Ruling by Local Officials Association

When a local officials association renders a decision, whether by an officer or the executive committee or the grievance committee, an official may appeal as follows:

- a. Written appeal to the OHSAA Assistant Commissioner responsible for the officials program
- b. The Assistant Commissioner may request assistance from the DOC and will render a timely decision which may uphold, set aside or alter in any manner the action of the local association.

10.3 Decision or Ruling by an OHSAA Administrator

When an OHSAA Administrator renders a decision or ruling an official may appeal as follows:

- a. Written appeal to the OHSAA Commissioner within 10 days of notification of the Administrative Ruling.
- b. Written appeal to the Board of Control when the decision or ruling is by the OHSAA Commissioner.
- c. The ruling by the Board of Control is final.

11. Officials Administration Calendar

It is the responsibility of each local officials association to keep accurate attendance records and report them on-line. It is not necessary for the District Officials Committee to meet in order to review attendance or suspensions.

NFOA Insurance Plan — Who is Covered? All officials who are currently registered/licensed with a member state high school association or affiliate association of the NFHS (if that association registers/licenses officials) are covered by the NFOA Insurance Program.

When Does Coverage Apply? The insurance coverage shall apply only while the member is engaging in officiating activities during regularly scheduled sports or activities competition. That sport/activity must be recognized in that state or U.S. territory/possession by the member state high school association or by high schools that follow the guidelines of the member state associations (or an NFHS affiliate association in the territory/possession). If a sport is recognized for either men or women in that state, territory or possession, the official will be covered for officiating both men and women. Coverage also applies while such member is officiating temporarily outside the United States, its territories and possessions, as long as the sport is recognized by one of the high school associations or an NFHS affiliate association. Officiating activities include assigning, chain crews, and attending or operating officiating camps, clinics and meetings. No coverage is provided for losses that result from or are associated with the officiating or duties related to the management of any professional sport or activity. Coverage is not limited to high school activities. It also applies to officiating activities for college, junior college, independent youth or recreational leagues, but only for sports that are recognized for high school participants by that state's high school association.

2007-2008 OFFICIALS SUPPLEMENTAL INSURANCE PROGRAM

This is only a very general reference to what coverage(s) the insurance policy (or policies) will provide, and is not intended to attempt to describe all of the various details pertaining to the insurance. Actual coverages are detailed in the policy of insurance and are always subject to all terms, provisions, conditions, and exclusions as contained herein.

The OHSAA currently enrolls all registered officials in the National Federation of Officials Association (NFOA). Through the NFOA, general liability, accident medical and accidental death and dismemberment insurance is provided. Please visit www.bollingerfhhs.com for more information about NFOA insurance program.

The OHSAA purchased additional coverage for its registered officials through American Specialty. The following summarizes the additional coverage provided to OHSAA officials.

All coverages will exclude claims for officiating at the college or professional level.

ELIGIBILITY & POLICY PERIOD (all coverages)

In order for coverage to apply, the individual must be a registered official with the OHSAA. Membership will be verified with the OHSAA before any claim is paid. Coverage for each official will begin the later of **July 1, 2006** or the date the official registers with the OHSAA, and will expire on **July 1, 2007**.

PARTICIPANT ACCIDENT BENEFITS

***Fee Loss:** Provides up to \$50 per game, \$500 per week, and \$2,000 per official for games/contests the official was unable to officiate **due to an injury suffered while officiating during a covered activity**. Coverage is limited to the sport in which the official was injured. A 14-day deductible period will apply for any claim submitted.

Accidental Death & Dismemberment: Policy provides \$5,000 limit for accidental death and dismemberment, including limited coverage for heart and circulatory disorders.

COVERED ACTIVITIES (*all coverages)

- This insurance coverage shall apply only while the member is engaging in officiating activities during regularly scheduled activities or sports competition. That sport/activity must be recognized in that state by the member state high school association or by high schools that follow the guidelines of the member state associations. If a sport is recognized for either men or women in that state, the official will be covered for officiating both men and women.
- Coverage may extend to include travel directly to and from a covered activity for all participant accident benefits. **No liability coverage is provided for travel to and from a covered activity.**
- Officiating activities include assigning, chain crew, and attending or operating officiating camps, clinics or meetings.
- All coverages will exclude claims for officiating at the college or professional level.

FEE LOSS:

- Coverage is limited to the sport in which the official was injured.

X. SPORT SPECIFIC REGULATIONS AND LOCAL OFFICIALS ASSOCIATIONS

1. BASEBALL

1.1 Regular Season Officials Requirements

- 1.11 High School Varsity — Minimum of one OHSAA Class 1 or Class 2 Baseball umpire required. Regardless of number, all must be Class 1 or Class 2.
- 1.12 High School Reserve/Junior Varsity — Minimum of one OHSAA Class 1 or Class 2 umpire required. Regardless of number, all must be Class 1 or Class 2.
- 1.13 Freshman/7-8th grade — OHSAA Class 1, 2 or 3 recommended.

1.2 Tournament Officials Requirements

- 1.21 Tournament level to which applicable — Sectional, District, Regional, State.
- 1.22 Minimum Requirements
 - 1.221 Must hold an OHSAA Class 1 Permit in baseball.
 - 1.222 Must have been an OHSAA Class 1 umpire in good standing the previous year.
 - 1.223 Must have attended an OHSAA-conducted rules interpretation meeting.

- 1.224 Must attend a minimum of four local rules discussion meetings.
- 1.225 Must have umpired a minimum of eight regular season varsity high school boys baseball games during the preceding Ohio season and must umpire four regular season varsity high school boys baseball games during the current season to be eligible for tournament assignment.
- 1.226 The Commissioner may assign an umpire to officiate more than one regional or state tournament game when there is a specific need.
- 1.227 Must be physically fit and have an athletic appearance.
- 1.228 An official may not officiate in both the boys Regional/State Baseball and girls Regional/State Softball Tournaments in the same year. Baseball umpires are ineligible to officiate the State Baseball Semis and Finals in successive years.

1.3 Required Uniform

The approved uniform for interscholastic baseball umpires is the Heather gray color pants with an MLU navy shirt with the OHSAA embroidered logo on the right breast. (Note: It is not permissible to wear a long sleeve garment under the short sleeve shirt.) Undershirts or t-shirts shall be red. When needed, a navy blue jacket or coat shall be worn. Official OHSAA apparel shall be purchased from only OHSAA authorized dealers. All umpires on a crew **must be dressed alike**. Navy caps with OHSAA printed in block letters on the crown must be worn and shall be purchased only from licensed dealers. Any other emblems or patches are not permitted on the officiating uniform, however an American flag may be worn appropriately. Jewelry may not be worn except wedding band, medical ID, or religious medal.

2.12 High School Reserve/Junior Varsity — Class 1 or Class 2 OHSAA Basketball only.

2.13 Freshman/7-8th grade — One Class, 1, 2, or 3 official required. All other officials recommended to be Class 1, 2 or 3 OHSAA basketball official or official in training.

2.2 Tournament Officials Requirements

2.21 Tournament level to which applicable — Sectional, District, Regional, State.

2.22 Minimum Requirements

2.221 Must hold an OHSAA Class 1 Permit in basketball.

2.222 Must have been an OHSAA Class 1 official in good standing the previous year.

2.223 Must attend an OHSAA State-conducted rules interpretation meeting.

2.224 Must attend a minimum of four local rules interpretation meetings.

2.225 Boys — Must have officiated a minimum of 12 boys regular season varsity high school basketball games during the previous Ohio season and must officiate a minimum of 12 boys regular season varsity high school basketball games during the current Ohio season.

Girls — Must have officiated a minimum of 12 girls regular season varsity high school basketball games during the previous Ohio season and must officiate a minimum of 12 girls regular varsity high school basketball games during the current Ohio season.

EXCEPTION #1: A Class 1 basketball official who officiates boys and girls varsity basketball meets the games eligibility requirements for both boys and girls tournaments if the official officiates a minimum of 10 regular season varsity girls games and a minimum of 10 regular season boys games in the same year.

2.226 An official is not eligible to officiate in both the boys and girls Regional and State Basketball Tournaments in the same year. In addition, a basketball official is ineligible to officiate a Boys State Basketball Tournament game in successive years, or Girls State Basketball Tournament game in successive years.

2.3 Required Uniform

Black and white vertically striped short sleeve knit shirt with v-neck collar, black slacks, black belt (if used), black socks, and predominately black shoes. Note: A warmup jacket shall be worn for regular season and OHSAA tournament games. It shall be black and unadorned except that it shall have the OHSAA logo on the left breast. The only legal jacket is that sold by authorized distributors. No watch or jewelry may be worn except wedding band, medical ID or religious medal. Emblems and patches are not permitted on the officiating uniform, however an American flag may be worn appropriately.

4.1 Regular Season Officials Requirements

4.11 High School Varsity — Class 1 OHSAA football only.

4.12 High School Reserve/Junior Varsity — Class 1 or Class 2 OHSAA football only.

4.13 Freshman/7-8th grade — One OHSAA Class 1, 2, or 3 official required. Recommended all additional officials be OHSAA Class 1, 2 or 3 officials or officials in training.

4.2 Tournament Officials Requirements

4.21 Tournament level to which applicable — Regional, State.

4.22 Minimum Requirements

4.221 Must have been an OHSAA Class 1 football official in good standing in the previous year. Must be a Class 1 official in the current sports year.

- 4.222 Must officiate a minimum of eight high school varsity football games during the current Ohio season.
- 4.223 Must have officiated a minimum of eight high school varsity football games during the previous Ohio season.
- 4.224 Must attend an OHSAA State Football Rules Interpretation Meeting.
- 4.225 Must attend a minimum of four local rules discussion meetings.
- 4.226 Must officiate during the current football season a minimum of five varsity high school games at the position for which applying.
- 4.227 Must complete an application certifying the above requirements and return the completed application to the OHSAA.
- 4.228 An official is ineligible to work a Championship Football game in successive years.
- 4.229 Must be physically fit and possess an athletic appearance.

4.3 Required Uniform

- 4.31 Black and white vertically striped, long or short-sleeved knit shirt. The shirts shall have one-inch stripes, a black knit cuff and Byron collar. All officials in a given game shall wear the same type shirt.
- 4.32 Standard, all white tapered knickers worn with a short overlap below the knee (not more than four inches). For non-varsity games, white or black shorts may be worn. The entire crew should be dressed alike.
- 4.33 One-piece northwestern stripe stocking. For non-varsity game, white crew socks may be worn.
- 4.34 Solid black football shoes with black laces.
- 4.35 Black baseball cap with white piping, except the referee who shall wear a white cap.

6. GYMNASTICS

6.1 Regular Season Officials Requirements

- 6.11 High School Varsity — Minimum of one OHSAA Class 1 judge required. It is strongly recommended that two OHSAA Class 1 judges officiate each meet. Class 2 judges may be utilized, but it is highly recommended that a Class 2 official judge with a Class 1 official.
- 6.12 High School Reserve/Junior Varsity — Minimum of one OHSAA Class 1 or Class 2 judge recommended.
- 6.13 Freshman/7-8th grade — OHSAA Class 1 or Class 2 or non-registered level 8 JCI or higher recommended.

6.2 Tournament Officials Requirements

- 6.21 Tournament level to which applicable — District, State.
- 6.22 Minimum Requirements
 - 6.221 District — Must be Class 1 or Class 2 on panel under guidance of Class 1.
 - 6.222 State — Must be an OHSAA Class 1 girls gymnastics judge.
 - 6.223 Must complete and file a yearly rules review examination.
 - 6.224 Must complete and return an application listing experience and judging preference.
 - 6.225 Must have officiating experience in position for which application is made.
 - 6.226 Must not be actively coaching girls gymnastics as a head coach at the high school level.
 - 6.227 Must have attended a state-conducted rules interpretation meeting in girls gymnastics.

6.3 Required Uniform

The officiating uniform for girls gymnastics officials is any combination of red, white or blue skirt, blouse or slacks, however an American flag may be worn appropriately. This uniform is mandatory in all regular season and tournament competition.

Note: The Official NAWGJ Judges Uniform may also be worn.

6.4 Assigning Procedures

- 6.41 Any individual acting as an OHSAA Assigner or as a volunteer limited assigner (possibly by a NAWGJ representative assigner for a group of high schools or a league) who schedules judges in

an areas to aid selection by athletic administrators, schools and leagues in girls gymnastics **shall follow the outlined assignment procedures:**

- 6.421 Will notify all rated area officials of the schools' schedules to obtain availability for these dates. An assigning meeting may be held, but notification must also be sent to those unable to attend.
- 6.422 Will assign FIRST any available OHSAA Registered Class 1 and Class 2 officials as per regulations.
- 6.423 Will assign additional officials when the number of contests on any given day/night exceeds the number of available registered OHSAA Officials in the following order: Officials holding a current JCI rating of level 9 or above or secondly the same with level 8. Communication and cooperation with NAWGJ Assigners will be necessary for confirmation of eligible officials who have any of these ratings.
- 6.424 Assignment of any non-rated officials shall only be made when it is determined that all registered and properly rated officials have been scheduled and none is available. Permission must be obtained from OHSAA assistant commissioner Dr. Deborah Moore. A non-rated official may not judge an event alone (as one single judge) and would have to be placed with a Class 1 judge. This may be accomplished at one time when all assignments are being made or may be on a case basis when the need arises. There may be times that a school may be asked if they can reschedule a competition to allow officials meeting requirements to be present.

Penalty — Officials who apply for OHSAA registration and knowingly do not meet the criteria or who are assigned and accept/officiate a contest without meeting the criteria outlined and without permission may be subject to penalty of: fine, censure and/or probation, suspension of officiating privilege.

AFTER RECEIVING A JOINT CERTIFICATION RATING, REQUEST AN APPLICATION FORM FROM THE OHSAA OFFICIATING DEPARTMENT TO APPLY FOR AN OHSAA OFFICIATING PERMIT.

8.1 Regular Season Officials Requirements

- 8.11 High School Varsity — Minimum of two OHSAA Class 1 or Class 2 officials required. Regardless of number officiating, all must be OHSAA Class 1 or Class 2 soccer officials.
- 8.12 High School Reserve/Junior Varsity — Minimum of two OHSAA Class 1 or Class 2 officials required. Regardless of number officiating, all must be OHSAA Class 1 or Class 2 soccer officials.
- 8.13 Freshman/7-8th grade — OHSAA Class 1, 2 or 3 recommended.

NOTE: If only one OHSAA official is present to officiate the contest, the game may be played if opposing coaches agree.

8.2 Tournament Officials Requirements

- 8.21 Tournament level to which applicable — Sectional, District, Regional, State.

8.22 Minimum Requirements

- 8.221 Must be a current Class 1 OHSAA soccer official.
- 8.222 Must have been a Class 1 official in good standing during the previous year.
- 8.223 Must attend OHSAA State Conducted Rules Interpretation Meeting.
- 8.224 Must attend a minimum of four local rules discussion meetings.
- 8.225 Must be physically fit.

8.226 BOYS — Must officiate a minimum of eight regular season boys varsity high school soccer games during the current Ohio season and must have officiated a minimum of eight regular season boys soccer games during the previous Ohio season.

GIRLS — Must officiate a minimum of eight regular season girls varsity high school soccer games during the current Ohio season and must have officiated a minimum of eight regular season girls soccer games during the previous Ohio season.

EXCEPTION #1: A Class 1 soccer official who officiates both boys and girls varsity soccer meets the games eligibility requirements for both boys and girls tournaments if the official officiates a minimum of 5 regular season varsity girls games and a minimum of 6 regular season varsity boys games in the same year.

8.3 Required Uniform

The OHSAA soccer officials uniform is the gold/black pinstriped jersey, either long or short sleeved, with all game officials wearing the same jersey. Black shorts, socks and shoes are required. Officials may wear either the red/black pinstriped jersey or black/white pinstriped jersey when they determine the gold does not contrast with a team's uniform. The OHSAA officials patch shall be worn on the left breast pocket, however an American flag may be worn appropriately. Jewelry may not be worn except for a medical ID, wedding band and watch.

- 9.11 High School Varsity — Minimum of one OHSAA Class 1 or Class 2 softball umpire required. Regardless of number, all must be Class 1 or Class 2.
- 9.12 High School Reserve/Junior Varsity — Minimum of one OHSAA Class 1 or Class 2 softball umpire required. Regardless of number, all must be Class 1 or Class 2.
- 9.13 Freshman/7-8th grade — OHSAA Class 1, 2 or 3 recommended.

NOTE: If only one OHSAA official is present to officiate the contest, the game may be played if opposing coaches agree.

9.2 Tournament Officials Requirements

- 9.21 Must hold an OHSAA Class 1 Permit in softball.
- 9.22 Must have been an OHSAA Class 1 umpire during the previous year.
- 9.23 Must attend an OHSAA State-conducted rules interpretation meeting.
- 9.24 Must attend a minimum of four local rules discussion meetings.

- 9.25 Must have umpired a minimum of eight regular season varsity high school girls softball games during the previous Ohio season and must umpire four regular season varsity high school girls softball games during the current season in order to be eligible for tournament assignment.
- 9.26 The Commissioner may assign an umpire to officiate more than one Regional or State Tournament when there is a specific need.
- 9.27 An umpire is ineligible to officiate in the State Softball Tournament Championships in successive years. Furthermore, an umpire is ineligible to work the State Softball and State Baseball Championships in the same year.

9.3 Required Uniform

The officiating uniform for interscholastic softball umpires will be Heather gray color pants, MLU navy shirt with the OHSAA embroidered logo on the right breast. (Note: It is not permissible to wear a long sleeve garment under a short sleeve shirt.) Undershirts or t-shirts shall be red. When needed, a navy blue jacket or coat shall be worn. Official OHSAA apparel shall be purchased from only OHSAA authorized dealers. All umpires on a crew must be **dressed alike**. 10.3 Required Uniform

The officiating uniform for swimming and diving officials shall be white shirt or blouse, white slacks or shorts, white shoes and socks. No watch except those used in timing or jewelry except wedding band, medical ID or religious medal may be worn. Emblems and patches are not permitted on the officiating uniform, however an American flag may be worn appropriately.

11.1 Meetings Required

11.11 Local — Must attend a minimum of four local rules discussion meetings. A maximum of two meetings held during the cross country season may be used to partially meet this requirement.

11.12 State — Must attend an OHSAA State-Conducted Rules Interpretation Meeting.

11.2 Regular Season Officials Requirements

11.21 High School Varsity — Minimum of one OHSAA Class 1 official required who shall be the referee or the referee/starter, in dual, triangular or quadrangular meets. It is RECOMMENDED that the referee shall not be a COACH of a competing team. The referee in meets involving five or more schools must be an OHSAA Class 1 official. If there is a non-coach registered official present, the coach of a competing team may not referee.

11.22 High School Reserve/Junior Varsity — Minimum of one OHSAA Class 1 official required who shall be the referee or the referee/starter, in dual, triangular or quadrangular meets. It is RECOMMENDED that the referee shall not be a COACH of a competing team. The referee in meets involving five or more schools must be an OHSAA Class 1 official. If there is a non-coach registered official present, the coach of a competing team may not referee.

11.23 Freshman/7–8th grade — OHSAA Class 1 or 3 recommended.

11.3 Tournament Officials Requirements

- 11.31 Tournament level to which applicable — Regional, State.
- 11.32 Must have been an OHSAA Class 1 track and field official during the previous year.
- 11.33 Must attend a minimum of four local rules discussion meetings, and one State-Conducted Rules Meeting.
- 11.34 Must complete and return an application listing experience and position preference. Only outdoor varsity high school experience during the Ohio season shall be considered.
- 11.35 Must have officiating experience in position for which application is made.
- 11.36 Must have a minimum of four years experience as a registered track official.
- 11.37 Must not be actively coaching track and field either as head or assistant coach at the high school level.

11.4 Required Uniform

The uniform shall be dark blue trousers (no blue denim), skirt or shorts and the OHSAA-registered officials shirt. The only legal shirt is the OHSAA Track & Field Officials' shirt and it is available from Honig's Whistle Stop (1-800-468-3284). A dark blue jacket is required when a jacket is worn. Sponsors of invitational and conference meets must further identify the clerks, starters, referees and head field judges by a distinctively colored sleeve, hat or vest. No emblems, patches or insignia of any type other than those referring to high school track and field or cross country may be worn by an official, however an American flag may be worn appropriately.

NOTE: The official OHSAA Track and Field Official's shirt must be purchased from an OHSAA authorized dealer.

12. VOLLEYBALL

12.1 Regular Season Officials Requirements

12.11 Varsity — One Class 1 official who shall be the referee required. The umpire shall be either Class 1 or Class 2 volleyball official.

EXCEPTION: If an emergency arises which prevents the **contracted** Class 1 official from being present, a Class 2 official may be used provided the schools mutually agree.

In the event only one Class 1 OHSAA registered official arrives to officiate the match, the match may be played provided the participating coaches agree.

12.12 Reserve/Junior Varsity — Two OHSAA Class 1 or 2 volleyball officials required.

12.13 Freshman/7–8th grade— Referee required and umpire recommended. OHSAA Class 1, 2 or 3 volleyball officials recommended.

12.14 Line Judges — For varsity and reserve/junior varsity volleyball competition, all line judges shall be either well-trained adults or students not listed on the volleyball eligibility certificate for the high school.

12.2 Tournament Officials Requirements

12.21 Tournament level to which applicable — Sectional, District, Regional, State.

12.22 Minimum Requirements

12.221 Must be a current OHSAA Class 1 volleyball official in good standing in order to be assigned as a Referee or Umpire.

12.222 Must have been an OHSAA Class 1 volleyball official during the previous season in order to officiate as a Referee.

12.223 Must attend a minimum of four local rules discussion meetings.

12.224 Must attend an OHSAA State-Conducted Rules Interpretation Meeting.

12.225 Must officiate a minimum of eight varsity high school matches during the current Ohio season and eight during the previous season.

12.226 An official is ineligible to officiate in successive state tournaments as referee/umpire.

12.3 Required Uniform

The officiating uniform for volleyball officials is a white long- or short-sleeved knit shirt with an OHSAA embroidered logo (only OHSAA authorized shirts), black skirt or black shorts with a minimum 4" inseam, or black culottes or black slacks, black belt (if used) and black or white shoes. Shirts are available from Fleming's Officials Supply (614-798-8888) or Honig's Whistle Stop (1-800-468-3284). A white sweater may be worn. When a skirt, shorts or culottes are worn, white socks will be worn. No watch or jewelry may be worn except a timing device, wedding band, medical ID or religious medal. Emblems and patches are not permitted on the officiating uniform, however an American flag may be worn appropriately.

Nominees must exemplify the highest standards of sportsmanship, ethical conduct and moral character and must carry the endorsement of the Ohio High School Athletic Association.

Nominations may be made in the following categories:

1. **ATHLETE** — a former student participant based on achievement in interscholastic athletics.
2. **COACH** — based on the merit of high school coaching achievement.
3. **OFFICIAL** — based on service as a high school official.
4. **CONTRIBUTOR** — an individual who has made a contribution to interscholastic athletics in some capacity other than athlete, coach or official including such areas as administration, sports medicine, sports media, etc.

All candidates will be judged on their significant and/or long-term contribution to interscholastic athletics. While many have served their state and local programs over a long and distinguished career, their accomplishments must have been worthy of national recognition for them to be considered. Longevity, without meaningful national impact, does not constitute appropriate credentials for Hall of Fame consideration.

Application forms may be obtained from the OHSAA office and must be complete in all respects and returned to the OHSAA no later than November 1.

2007 Officials Hall of Fame Inductees

Twelve new members have been selected as the 18th class of inductees into the Ohio High School Athletic Association Officials Hall of Fame. Selections were made by the OHSAA Officials Advisory Committee. To be selected, an individual must be nominated by a local officials association or, when no local association exists in that district or sport, a registered OHSAA official may nominate another official. The 2007 class was officially inducted during ceremonies July 21 in Columbus.



Randy J. Bachman of Napoleon has an official's pedigree: his late father Don was inducted into the OHSAA Officials Hall of Fame in 1989. Randy has been calling balls and strikes, as well as patrolling the hardwood, for 30 years. Although recently retired from basketball officiating after calling nearly 1,000 boys varsity games and numerous tournaments, he continues to umpire high school baseball as well as collegiate baseball. He is on the Big Ten Conference, Mid-American Conference, Atlantic 10 Conference and Horizon League collegiate umpire staffs. Randy has umpired 24 OHSAA Regional Baseball Tournaments and 16 state series. He served several terms as a rules interpreter for his local association. Randy is a member of the Napoleon Optimist Club, a club dedicated to helping young people, where he held the club's statewide lieutenant governor position.



John Bruggenmeier is a retired educator – teacher, coach, and athletic administrator. His entire 40-year career in education was invested with Old Fort Schools in Seneca County. While at Old Fort, John coached boys and girls basketball at every level of competition. He started a soccer program, assisted in founding the Midland Athletic League and served two terms as president. John served as an OHSAA tournament manager for the sports of volleyball, boys and girls basketball, baseball, softball and soccer. He was recognized as an athletic administrator and tournament manager who was truly a friend of officials. His professional treatment of officials and his vocal support for officials earned him “AD of the Year” by the Northwest District Officials Committee. Officials often remarked that John made them feel welcome and provided an accommodating reception at Old Fort High School.



Clyde “Pog” Ervin retired from football officiating in 1997 after a 37-year career. He officiated many of the high profile football games throughout Ohio. During his career, he often worked the umpire position with referee Sam Fausto. Sam remembers “Pog” as “one of the best ever in working with kids.” Clyde joins other members of his four-person officiating crew – Fausto, Jordan Bessozi, and Joe Pangrazio – in the OHSAA Officials Hall of Fame. Clyde worked an extensive varsity schedule and still had time for 7-8th, freshman and pee wee games. He officiated in the OHSAA football tournaments on several occasions. Clyde was the rules interpreter for the Eastern District Football Officials Association, served as a training class instructor and represented officials on the old OHSAA Football Rules Advisory Committee. Clyde has been active in Rotary, Elks, Masons and the Claymont Foundation. Retired Claymont football coach and high school principal Jeff Gyrko thought highly of Clyde's football officiating and even more highly of him personally by calling him “a great citizen.”



Dr. Patrick C. Haven, M.D. has been involved with interscholastic officiating for more than 27 years. Dr. Havens is a meticulous official with an outstanding command of the rules and mechanics. He has officiated OHSAA post-season assignments in the sports of football, basketball, and baseball. Pat advanced to work the state girls basketball tournament the same year he won a bout against a near fatal illness. He has served as a local rules interpreter in all three sports as well as an OHSAA certified instructor in each sport. Pat continues to serve his local associations in several leadership roles. He currently serves the OHSAA as the vice president of the Northwest District Officials Committee and on the Northwest District Appeals and Review Board. Dr. Havens expects nothing less than 100 percent commitment in everything he does.



Fred P. Heyer of Willoughby has done it all! Baseball umpire - 38 years. Softball umpire - 30 years. Volleyball official - 15 years. Basketball official - 25 years. He even patrolled the ice rinks as a hockey official for 13 years. Fred officiated numerous post-season assignments in each sport, including seven state baseball tournaments. He has been a leader in the local officials associations in which he held membership and has served as rules interpreter, secretary and OHSAA instructor. Fred retired as the official scorer and statistician of the Cleveland Indians and as the scoreboard operator for the Cleveland Browns. He had served the Cavaliers as their game-day media host and was the official scorer for the American Hockey League's Cleveland Barons. Fred continues as the official scorer for the Lake County Captains, the Indians' Class A affiliate. Mr. Heyer has managed OHSAA regional tournaments in softball and baseball. Fred is an OHSAA assigner and the secretary of the Northeast Ohio Conference.



Kyle McNeely has made a lasting impression on high school sports! As an official in Texas and Ohio, he has officiated baseball and football for 32 years. His on-field experience is extensive: 30 years varsity officiating; state baseball and football tournament assignments in Texas and Ohio; 18 years of collegiate baseball and football officiating; state and regional assignments for CABA, AAU and American Legion baseball; 2004 World Baseball Championship Tournament (nine games) in Taiwan; all-star baseball and football game assignments, Kyle is an OHSAA state interpreter in the sport of baseball. He received the National Federation Officials Association State Baseball Umpire of the Year Award in 1992 (Texas) and 2004 (Ohio). He was awarded the NFOA Distinguished Service Award in 2000. Kyle has authored a weekly newspaper column on football officiating and has several published articles in the *NFHS Officials Quarterly* magazine. He is a sought-after clinician. He has contributed to the OHSAA officials

instructor training; the OHSAA Officials First Conference, and clinics in six other states. Currently, Kyle is serving a four-year term as chair of the NFHS Baseball Rules Committee.



Robert Ray Montgomery began an illustrious officiating career in 1962. Bob has been a member of the Ohio Valley of Approved Basketball Officials for 45 years. He served the OVABO as president, vice president, executive committee member, rules interpreter and training class instructor. "Monty" has officiated well over 2,000 regular season games and has extensive tournament experience in West Virginia and Ohio. He has officiated 10 regionals and five OHSAA State Basketball Tournaments. Bob called collegiate basketball in the West Virginia Conference. In addition to being a highly skilled basketball official, Bob has umpired baseball since 1962. Bob may have made his most significant contribution to basketball officiating through his mentoring of young officials. His sustained record of excellence, coupled with his selfless assistance to promising officials, has led to this Hall of Fame recognition.



James A. Pepperney, Jr. began officiating high school volleyball in 1978. His expertise was quickly recognized as he was assigned to OHSAA post-season play in 1979. He has officiated in OHSAA district and regional tournaments every year since 1980. Jim has officiated in the OHSAA state volleyball tournament matches along with numerous all-star matches. He is a charter member of the Mahoning Valley Volleyball Officials Association, for which he has served as secretary for the past 25 years. "Pep" played an important role in gaining OHSAA approval of allowing officials to wear shorts during the regular season and in changing the uniform tops from a striped shirt to the current solid white shirt. Jim is a retired educator and coach. He earned teacher of the year honors as well as coach of the year in baseball and basketball. James loves volleyball and, for over a quarter of a century, he has dedicated a major portion of his life to this game.



Daniel J. Steiner is a “man for all seasons.” He has been an OHSAA official for 24 years in football and 29 years in basketball, where he has worked several post-season assignments. However, his first love is baseball. He has umpired more than a dozen regional baseball games and few state series. When not umpiring the state tournament, he helps the tournament run smoothly by assisting the OHSAA and tournament staff, along with the tournament umpire crews. He is an OHSAA certified instructor who has conducted the Central Ohio Baseball Umpires Association class for new officials for the past seven years. He serves as an OHSAA assigner for over 100 junior and senior high schools in Central Ohio. Dan serves as secretary of the Central District Officials Committee and the Central District Appeals and Review Board. He is a member of the OHSAA Officials Advisory and Hall of Fame committees. M. Kelly Whelan began officiating basketball in 1976. Her father, the late Ed Monahan, was an outstanding official who encouraged her to take up a whistle. Surely he’s smiling down on her today! Kelly has been a dedicated and hard working official for 31 years. She worked her first sectional tournament game in 1980 and has received post-season assignments every year since except for the two seasons that she “took off” to become a mother. OHSAA Kelly has officiated 11 Girls State Basketball Tournament games. Always working to get better, she has attended numerous camps and clinics. Although she officiated at the collegiate level, her first love is the high school game, so she has directed her time and talent in that venue. Kelly is an excellent volleyball official who has officiated eight OHSAA State Volleyball Tournaments and 17 regional tournaments. Ms. Whelan has served in several leadership positions for her local officials associations and has been a member of the OHSAA Sportsmanship, Ethics and Integrity Committee since

1990 as a representative for all Ohio sports officials. Retired OHSAA Associate Commissioner Fred Dafler wrote that “Kelly always fulfilled her (officiating) responsibilities with grace - it was always about the players.”



Bryan Keith Wilson of Jackson began his officiating career in 1978. He would often officiate the JV game after playing in the varsity game on the same day. Keith has umpired 15-plus regional and state baseball games. He has seen duty in several all-star baseball games and has worked the Ohio High School Baseball Coaches Association All-Star Game. Mr. Wilson officiated regional assignments in both the OHSAA football and volleyball tournaments. Keith is well known for being in control of every assignment and completely professional. He has served as an officer in the Jackson Baseball/Softball Umpires Association and the local volleyball association. He has served as a clinician at several Southeast officials clinics.



Henry Zaborniak, Jr. began officiating football and basketball in 1975. His officiating career includes more than a decade of interscholastic football and basketball games. He officiated collegiate men’s basketball at the Division III level and women’s basketball in Division I. He officiated football in the Mid-American Conference for six years and has been in the Big Ten for the past 10 seasons. Hank officiated two seasons in what is now called NFL Europe. Henry joined the OHSAA staff in July 1989 as coordinator of officials and publications. He was promoted to assistant commissioner in 1995. During his tenure Henry has overseen the OHSAA officials program, which now has over 16,000 officials, 270 local associations, 500 officiating instructors and 250 certified assigners. In 1993 he initiated one of the first state association-sponsored football officiating clinics. He provided three-person basketball officiating clinics and serves as director of the OHSAA Officials Convention, Officials First. Henry implemented requirements for mandatory

training for prospective officials in seven sports and has overseen the implementation of a revamped officials tournament selection process. Henry has served on several National Federation committees: football rules; football officials mechanics; officials education; publications and officials advisory. Hank serves on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Sports Officials. He received the NFOA National Distinguished Contributor Award in 2001 and was a contributing author to the *Successful Officiating* textbook.

FORMING A LOCAL OFFICIALS ASSOCIATION

STANDING COMMITTEES

XII. REGULATIONS FOR OHSAA CERTIFIED ASSIGNERS

- 1.1 An OHSAA Certified Assigner shall be required to pay an annual registration fee and to attend an OHSAA Assigners certification seminar biannually.
- 1.2 An OHSAA Certified Assigner will be familiar with OHSAA regulations and officiating classification requirements. Assigners will assign/contract only those officials who possess a current and appropriate OHSAA permit.
- 1.3 An OHSAA Certified Assigner shall execute a written contract with the school(s) or league(s) for which assignments are made. This contract shall clearly outline the assigner's fee and each party's expectations. A current valid contract shall be submitted with the annual registration form.
- 1.4 An OHSAA Certified Assigner shall assign officials that are mutually acceptable to the competing schools. An Assigner shall obtain a list of acceptable officials from the schools for which assignments are made.
- 1.5 An OHSAA Certified Assigner shall assign officials to contests without regard to race or gender.
- 1.6 An OHSAA Certified Assigner will assign officials based on competence and certification; officiating assignments may not be denied based on the official's membership (or not) in a local association.
- 1.7 An OHSAA Certified Assigner or administrator will issue valid contracts to officials. Valid contracts shall include the contest date, time, place and fee (site TBAs are acceptable). Contracts must be signed by an OHSAA Certified Officials Assigner appointed by the school administrator or the home school administrator.
- 1.8 An OHSAA Certified Assigner shall not allow officials to schedule their own substitutes or give their assignment to another official. Officials who fail to honor contracts shall be reported in writing within 10 days of the violation, to the OHSAA Coordinator of Officials.
- 1.9 An OHSAA Certified Assigner shall not accept money or gifts from officials receiving assignments. Assigners that assign officials to interscholastic contests shall not require individual officials to pay "booking" fees.
- 1.10 An OHSAA Certified Assigner may be paid by the school(s) or league(s) for which assignments are made. A local officials association may, by majority vote of all of its members, elect an Assigner. If the membership elects an Assigner and wishes to establish a salary for the Assigner, the salary must be established by a majority vote of all members.
- 1.11 An OHSAA Certified Assigner may not establish game fees.
- 1.12 An OHSAA Certified Assigner is expected to be honest in all dealings with officials, school personnel and OHSAA staff. Assigners who fail to follow OHSAA bylaws or regulations will be subject to penalties which include, but are not limited to, a maximum fine of \$100 per violation, public censure, probation and suspension as an Assigner.
- 1.13 These regulations shall apply to home school administrators as they assign officials.
- 1.14 An OHSAA Certified Assigner is ineligible for OHSAA post-season tournament assignments at the Regional or and State tournaments (effective August 1, 2008).

XIII. LOCAL OFFICIALS ASSOCIATION

A. Procedure For Organizing A Local Officials Association

An application form must be completed and forwarded to the Ohio High School Athletic Association. Application forms may be obtained from the OHSAA office. The application when completed must include the following attached documents.

1. A statement explaining the reasons why a local officials association should be established in the area.
2. A copy of the Constitution and Bylaws of the proposed association.
3. A list of officers.
4. The name of the local rules interpreter in the particular sport.
5. The list of possible members (minimum of 15 required).*
6. Proposed dates, place, time and agenda for meetings.
7. A statement signed by an officer of the sponsoring association stating their agreement to serve as sponsor.

NOTE: When a local officials association agrees to sponsor a new local officials association, the sponsorship is binding and may not be withdrawn without approval of the applicant and the OHSAA. Failure to comply with sponsorship requirements could result in the sponsoring association being placed on probation or its charter revoked.

When all of the above documents are in order, they shall be forwarded to the OHSAA.

The application will then be reviewed and considered as follows:

1. Eight copies will be made and sent to the DOC Secretary. It shall be the responsibility of the District Officials Committee to investigate and report its finding with recommendation to the Officials Appeals and Review Board.
2. Based upon the District Officials Committee report, the Officials Appeals and Review Board will make a recommendation to the Board of Control. No application may be tabled. It must be acted upon either favorably or unfavorably within one year of the date it is sent to the Officials Appeals and Review Board.
3. If no recommendation is made within one year, the application will be forwarded to the Board of Control with the recommendation to approve.
4. If approval for the local association is given by the Board of Control, the officials association will be accepted on a one year probationary basis, authorized to conduct rules discussion meetings for official credit and subject to the rules and regulations of the OHSAA.

The sponsoring association will file a report with the OHSAA at the conclusion of the probationary period with their recommendation.

*Minimum membership requirements may be waived for a period of one year for new associations in wrestling and baseball or for any association located a considerable distance from another association in the same sport which demonstrates an active and vital program through attendance and type of meetings conducted.

B. Duties Of Local Officials Associations

1. Local officials associations are chartered for the primary purposes of recruiting officials and conducting continual training and for the improvement of officials and officiating.
 - 1.1 Local associations shall actively recruit prospective officials without prejudice toward race, religion or gender.
 - 1.2 Local associations shall appoint a training coordinator who shall oversee the initial training class and work cooperatively with the association interpreter to provide quality continuing education through local association classes and meetings.
 - 1.3 Local associations shall provide a process to identify individuals' officiating-related deficiencies, ways to improve and a timeline for improvement.

- 1.4 Local associations are authorized to censure, place on probation, suspend local association membership and/or recommend suspension of the OHSAA permit. Issues that must be investigated and resolved by the local association are unethical conduct, unsatisfactory officiating, failure to comply with local association or OHSAA rules or regulations.
 - 1.5 Local associations shall provide a grievance procedure for its members.
 - 1.6 Local associations shall keep accurate attendance records. Officials that are not a member of any OHSAA local association shall be charged \$10 for each meeting attended.
 2. Local associations may elect an Assigner. Such Assigners must then comply with OHSAA Certified Assigners Regulations.
 - 2.1 Local associations may not set officiating fees that are mandatory for a member to change.
- C. Requirements For Officials Association To Maintain Recognized Status
1. Must maintain a minimum membership of 15.
 2. Must file with the OHSAA the following reports completed in full by deadline dates:
 - a. Officers and meeting dates questionnaire.
 - b. Annual Report of association activities.
 - c. Other reports as required.
 3. Must file with the OHSAA a copy of amended Constitution as soon as possible after amendments are made.
 4. Must notify OHSAA of changes in Local Interpreters as they occur.
 5. Must adhere to the following regulations for local rules discussion meetings.
 - 5.1 Each local rules meeting must involve discussion regarding rules, interpretations, situations and officiating mechanics for a minimum of one hour, fifteen minutes.
 - 5.2 In order to receive credit for a meeting, an official must be present within 10 minutes of the start of the meeting and must stay until the conclusion of the meeting.
 - 5.3 Officials are encouraged to attend every scheduled meeting but the minimum requirement is: Baseball-4, Basketball-4, Football-4, Ice Hockey-3, Soccer-4, Swimming and Diving-3, Track and Field-4, Volleyball-4, Wrestling-4.
 - 5.4 Each local association shall schedule a minimum of two more meetings than the number required for an official to attend; **a minimum of six each.**
 - 5.5 A two and one-half hour meeting in one day cannot be credited as attending two meetings.
 - 5.6 Meetings held on separate days each count as a meeting.
 - 5.7 Clinics conducted and sponsored by an association other than the OHSAA may count as one local rules discussion meeting provided the clinic has received advance OHSAA approval.
 - 5.8 Social meetings or annual meetings to elect officers do not fulfill requirements for a local rules discussion meeting.
 - 5.9 If it becomes necessary to conduct local association business, it is recommended that the business meeting be held following the rules discussion.
 - 5.91 Meetings conducted for attendance credit must be scheduled within the guidelines as established in the secretaries' mailings.
 6. It is mandatory that the Secretary or other local association officer attend the Local Association Secretary Clinic each year or as may be required by the OHSAA office. Failure to attend will result in the local association being placed on probation for one year. Failure to attend for two consecutive years could result in the suspension of the local association.
 7. The Local Association Secretary or other local association officer must attend a minimum of one District Officials Committee meeting per year in the respective sport. Failure to attend required meetings will result in probation for one year with recommendation for loss of charter for continued lack of attendance.

8. Membership in local officials associations.

8.1 Any official holding a Class 1, 2 or 3 Permit in a given sport is eligible for membership and voting privileges in any local association chartered by the OHSAA in that sport. Such membership cannot be denied by a local association because of the official's refusal to join a related organization or association.

8.2 An official holding a Class 1, 2 or 3 Permit in a sport may not be denied membership and voting privileges in a local officials association because the official holds membership in another local officials association.

8.3 A local officials association may exclude an OHSAA-registered official from membership in a local association in the sport in which registered and deny the registered official the full benefits of membership for unethical conduct, failure to pay local association membership dues, failure to comply with OHSAA or local association regulations, and/or unsatisfactory officiating.

D. Failure to Comply

A local association is required to meet or exceed all requirements and regulations as set forth in the Handbook for Officials, annual secretary mailings and others that may be introduced from time to time.

When a lack of compliance is determined, the local association will receive written notification of the deficiencies, a time line for obtaining compliance and the appropriate penalties.

Penalties shall include, but not be limited to, monetary fines, ineligibility of member officials for tournaments, public censure, probation, suspension or revocation of the local association charter.

XIV. STANDING COMMITTEES

A. District Officials Committee

1. Introduction —

Each district shall have a District Officials Committee (DOC).

2. Membership —

2.1 There shall be one person from each local association who is the voting member on the DOC.

2.2 It is recommended that the voting member hold the position of local association secretary.

3. Officers —

3.1 There shall be a President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer. Complete information is available on the OHSAA website.

- 3.2 The term of office shall run from August 1 to July 31 each year.
- 3.3 The President and Vice-President shall be appointed by the membership of the DOC. The officers must be voting members of the DOC.
- 3.4 The Secretary-Treasurer will be elected by the Officials Appeals and Review Board and will serve as secretary of the Officials Appeals and Review Board. The term of office shall be three years.
- 3.5 Each DOC president shall serve a two-year term.

Duties of Officers —

- 4.1 The President shall preside at meetings of the District Officials Committee.
- 4.2 The Vice-President shall serve as presiding officer when the President is absent or unable to perform the duties of the President.
- 4.3 The Secretary-Treasurer shall:

- a) Keep complete minutes of each DOC Meeting. Copies of the minutes shall be sent to:
 - 1) Each committee member
 - 2) Each District Athletic Board Member
 - 3) One copy to the OHSAA — c/o Henry Zaborniak

Minutes must be forwarded to the OHSAA office within two months of the date of the meeting. Failure to do so will result in a fine of \$50 withheld from the Officials Refund for each delinquency.

- b) Keep complete attendance records of officials in the district. These records shall be supplied by the secretary of each local association as requested. All attendance should be done online.
- c) Work cooperatively with OHSAA and other DOC's.
- d) Send to the OHSAA a list of those officials who have been suspended.
- e) Serve as liaison between the District Officials Committee and the OHSAA Commissioner.
- f) Support the Constitution and Bylaws, Sports Regulations, Handbook for Officials and Board of Control action relative to officials and officiating.
- g) Attend the annual clinic for local association secretaries. Failure to attend — first year – probation; two consecutive years – possible suspension.
- h) Keep complete and accurate record of all finances and report annually to the District Athletic Board.

5. Duties of the District Officials Committee

- 5.1 To hold meetings of the full committee a minimum of once per year to oversee the local association performances.
- 5.2 The District Officials Committee shall determine the suspension of an official for failure to attend required meetings. The DOC may excuse an official from required meetings when such absence was unavoidable. Online attendance reporting may substitute for a meeting at the DOC.
 - 5.21 An official suspended by the DOC may appeal the decision to the Officials Appeals and Review Board.
 - 5.22 If after suspension by the DOC it is determined that an error was made, the District Officials Secretary is authorized to remove the suspension.
 - 5.23 When an official produces evidence of compliance with meeting attendance after the denial of appeal by the Officials Appeals and Review Board, the suspension will stand.

- 5.3 To supervise the local officials associations within the district in regard to:
 - a) visit every association annually in order to evaluate quality of meeting, attendance, process, etc.
 - b) an association that denies attendance to non-member officials.
 - c) an association that does not provide rules meetings in quantity, quality and length of meeting in accordance with regulations.
 - d) an association that does not keep fair and complete attendance records.

The DOC shall have the authority to reprimand such an association. It may also recommend probation or suspension. Such recommendation shall be forwarded to the Officials Appeals and Review Board for consideration and recommendation.
- 5.4 To assist local associations by:
 - a) developing programs to train association officers.
 - b) promoting the rules and regulations of the OHSAA.
 - c) providing educational grants.
 - d) reporting individuals to the OHSAA who are officiating contests when not licensed to do so.
 - e) investigations as needed.
- 5.5 To investigate when an application for a new association is received and to report to the Officials Appeals and Review Board regarding the need and the availability of the sponsoring association. The DOC shall submit its report with a recommendation.
- 5.6 To elect members to the Officials Appeals and Review Board for a term of four years.

All elections shall be for a term of four years except elections to fill an unexpired term. Elections to fill unexpired terms shall carry a term so that the term expires at the same time as the regular term would have ended. An official may not be elected to serve consecutive terms.
- 5.7 To assist the Officials Appeals and Review Board, the Board of Control and the Commissioner as requested.

B. District Officials Appeals and Review Board

1. Introduction

Each district shall have a District Officials Appeals and Review Board (DOARB).

2. Membership

2.1 There shall be 14 voting members on the Officials Appeals and Review Board.

2.2 The voting membership shall be as follows:

- a) Six District Athletic Board members
- b) Four officials elected by the District Officials Committee
- c) One Secretary-Treasurer of the Officials Appeals and Review Board

2.3 District Officials Appeals and Review Boards. All information is available on the OHSAA website.

3. Officers

3.1 There shall be a President and a Vice-President who are respectively the President and Vice-President of the District Athletic Board.

3.2 There shall be a Secretary who is elected by the Officials Appeals and Review Board for a term of three years from August 1 to July 31 and who serves simultaneously as Secretary-Treasurer of the District Officials Committee. The OHSAA staff person responsible for the supervision of the officials program shall be present as a consultant.

4. Duties of Officers

4.1 The President shall preside at the meetings of the Officials Appeals and Review Board and conduct all meetings according to Robert's Rules of Order.

4.2 The Vice-President shall serve as presiding officer when the President is absent or unable to perform the duties of the President.

4.3 The Secretary shall:

- a) Keep complete minutes of each Officials Appeals and Review Board Meeting and forward a copy to each Officials Appeals and Review Board Member and six copies to the OHSAA Office.

5. Duties of Officials Appeals and Review Board

5.1 Appeals Board

- a) For officials suspended by the District Officials Committee — The decision of the Officials Appeals and Review Board is final and may not be appealed to the Board of Control or Commissioner.
- b) For local associations that are recommended for probation or suspension — The Officials Appeals and Review Board will forward its recommendation to the Board of Control.

5.2 Recommendation Board

- a) To the Board of Control whether or not an application for a new local association should be approved — This recommendation must be forwarded to the Board of Control within one year from the date the application is forwarded to the District Officials Committee. Applications older than one year will automatically carry a recommendation for approval.
- b) To the Officials Advisory Committee of proposals to adopt, modify or delete regulations relative to the officials program.

C. Officials Advisory Committee

The OHSAA Officials Advisory Committee was created in order to provide officials with an organized method of collecting and discussing issues related to interscholastic officiating in Ohio. The O.A.C. will advise the OHSAA staff and Board of Control on matters pertaining to the OHSAA Officials Program.

The O.A.C. will meet twice annually with authorization to meet additionally, if required. The Committee will review proposals submitted by local associations, the District Officials Committees and other sources. Procedure and policies used to administer the Officials Program will be periodically reviewed. The Committee may submit recommendations to the Board of Control.

Membership on the Officials Advisory Committee shall be limited to a maximum of 21 voting members. Membership will reflect the diversity of the officiating population and shall be representative of sport, geography, level of experience, race and gender. Six of the 21-member committee will be the District Officials Secretaries with the other 15 members serving three-year terms. Terms will be staggered. The OHSAA staff may serve as ex-officio members. The OHSAA administrator responsible for the Officials Program will serve as the Executive Secretary.

6. Recommended Procedure For Proposals

6.1 In order to provide for as much review and consideration as possible, it is recommended that the following steps be followed for proposals to adopt, modify or delete regulations relative to officials and officiating.

Step 1 — Review and recommendation by local officials association.

Step 2 — Review and recommendation by District Officials Committee.

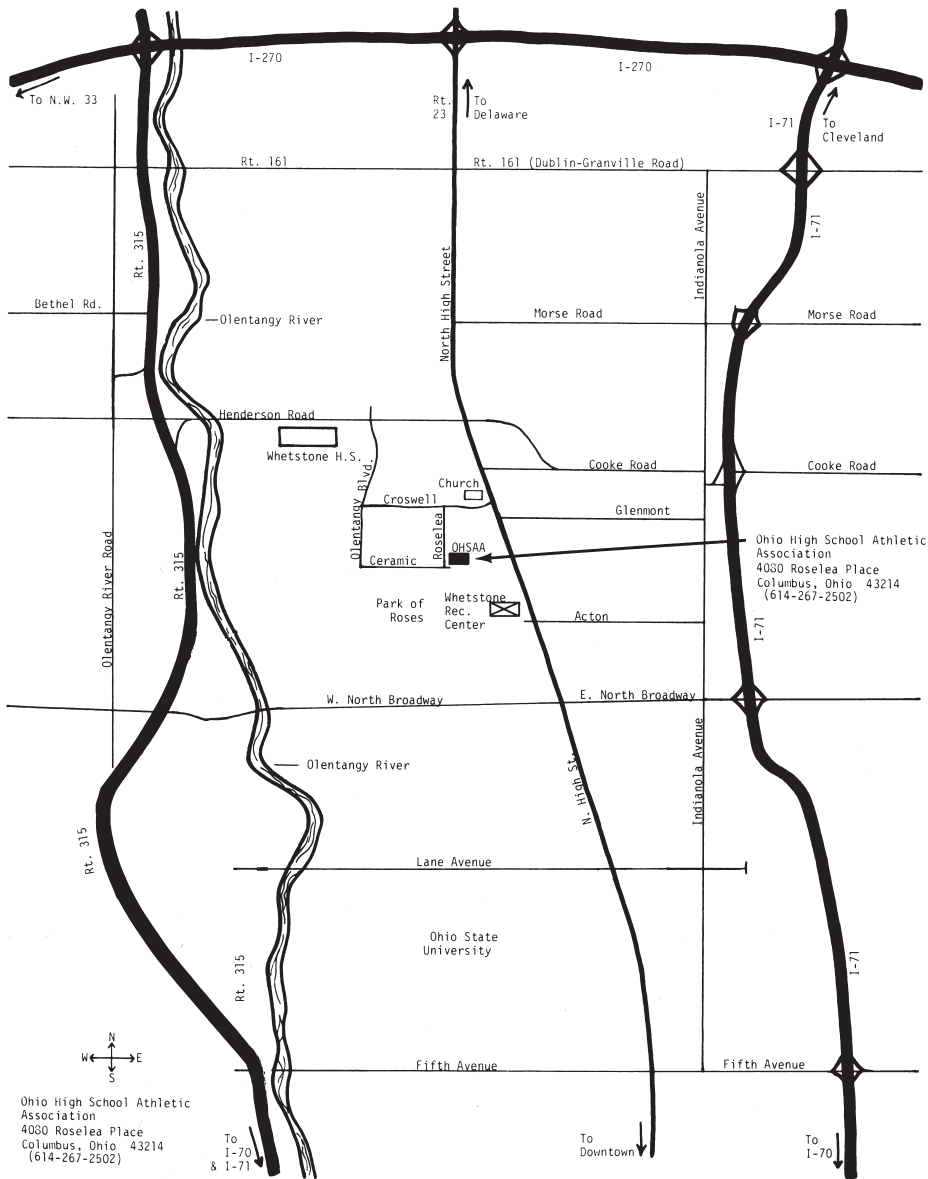
Step 3 — Review and recommendation by District Officials Appeals and Review Board.
